Council's general Consultation Policy is incorporated in Council's overall policy manual document contained in the document management system.

Council does not consult with the community directly on the LTAcMP but incorporates the critical elements (including funding, expenditure, levels of service) from the LTAcMP into the LTCCP and consults widely with the community on this. This gives the community the opportunity to consider the options and costs for Levels of Service and provide feedback on willingness to pay.
