8. What is your submission on the proposed Code of Practice?

Section 5.5.1 of the Code of Practice (CoP) addresses 'Accessway Sight Lines'; Figure 5-10 sets out both urban and rural accessways minimum sight line requirements. The minimum sight distances are less than those recommended in Table App5B/1, Appendix 5B of the NZTA 'Planning Policy Manual' (PPM, 2007) for accessways onto the state highway. Waka Kotahi would like Figure 5-10 amended to require that accessways onto a state highway have minimum sight distances that align with those recommended in the PPM. Section 5.3.18.2 of the CoP indicates that culvert pipes shall be a minimum of 300 mm in diameter. Waka Kotahi requires a culvert on a vehicle crossing onto a state highway to have a minimum diameter of 375mm, and we would request that the CoP be amended to align with the NZTA 375mm minimum culvert diameter for crossings onto the highway.
